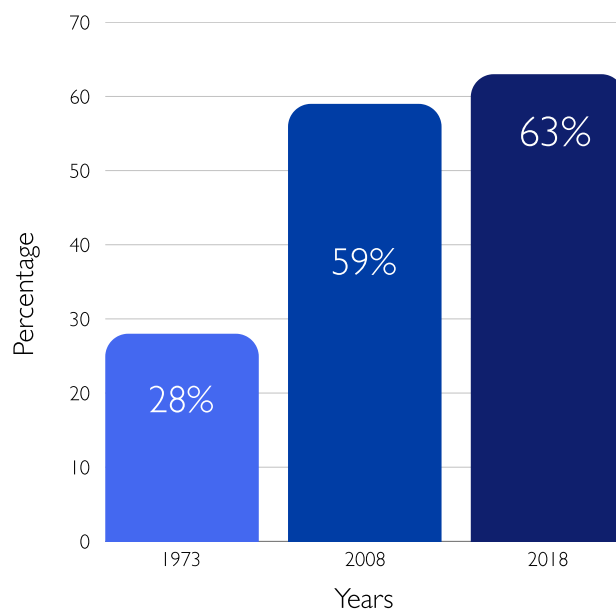

What is the GED® test?

The 2014 GED® test is a four-subject high school equivalency test that measures skills required by high schools and requested by colleges and employers. The four subjects are Science, Social Studies, Mathematical Reasoning, and Reasoning Through Language Arts (RLA).

2014 GED® Test Basics

- 4 test subjects: Reasoning Through Language Arts (RLA), Mathematical Reasoning, Science, and Social Studies
- Students must score a minimum of 145
- Students don't have to take all 4 tests at once
- Delivered on computer
- Available in both English and Spanish
- Approximately 8 hours for all 4 test subjects

Three Passing Levels

- GED® Passing Score 145 – 164 = Pass / High School Equivalent
- GED® Score 165 – 174 = GED® College Ready
- GED® Score 175 – 200 = GED® College Ready + Credit

Required GED Registration Items

- Picture ID: Current Kansas driver's license or Kansas I.D. card
 - Registration/Test fees: Due at time of registration
 - **If you are 16 or 17 years old**, you will need two forms completed by your school district:
 - Compulsory Attendance Exemption Form
 - Compulsory School Attendance Disclaimer

- ☐ Are at least 18 years old
- ☐ Are 16 or 17 years old and have the completed paperwork that your state may require
- ☐ Aren't enrolled in high school

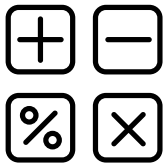

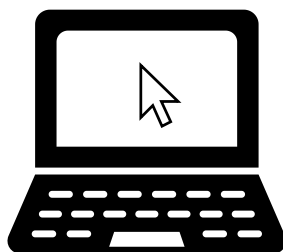

The test is delivered on computer at an authorized testing center. Many states also offer the online proctored test, which you can take from home.

WHAT'S ON THE TEST?

Reasoning Through Language Arts

- Includes a 10-minute break
- Includes one essay that you have 45 minutes to write
- Measures your:
 - Ability to read closely, write clearly, and edit and understand written text
 - Ability to understand, interpret, and answer questions based on text
 - Understanding of basic English skills at a level needed to succeed in college or a job

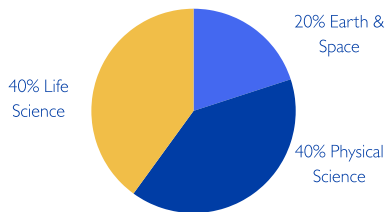
Mathematical Reasoning

- 2 parts with no break
- No calculator allowed on the first part
- Can use a TI-30XS calculator for the remaining questions
- Includes multiple choice, drop-down, and a variety of technology-enhanced items
- Calculator guide is provided
- Math formulas and a calculator reference are provided
- Measures quantitative problem-solving and algebraic (55%) and quantitative (45%) problem-solving abilities

Science

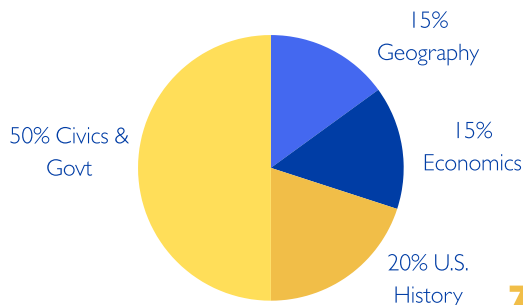
- No break
- Can use a TI-30XS calculator
- Measures your:
 - Ability to read, understand, and interpret science related text
 - Problem-solving abilities in science-related situations
