This chart contains the results of the one-year Follow-Up Study of the 2024-25 program completers. The study was conducted in 2026. Results of this annual survey are reported to the State of Kansas and compiled in the “Kansas Training Information Program” publication. Percent employed or continuing education is based on the number of students contacted, not the number of students completing. 98% of graduates contacted were employed in their field of study or continuing their education.
